Winners for Essay and Poster Competition on MEAs Announced

In mid-October, the Anguilla National Trust launched an essay and poster competition that focussed on multilateral environmental agreements (MEAs) and the benefits that may provide to Anguilla through their extension and adoption at the national level.

The Trust is pleased to announce that Jemila Morson, a fifth form student at the Albena Lake Hodge Comprehensive School, won first place for her essay on The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change. Tawnya Richardson, a third form student, took second place for her essay on The Convention on the Prevention of Marine Pollution by Dumping of Wastes and other Matter. Canita Ruan, a Grade Six student from Morris Vanterpool Primary School won first place for her poster and Jelani Morson, a Grade Five student from Teacher Gloria Omalulu Institute won second place for his. Both primary school students drew posters creatively depicting the theme “Think Global, Act Local: Protecting Anguilla’s Plants and Animals for the Anguillians and the World.” For her essay, Jemila will be awarded a Dell personal computer while Canita will receive a scholarship worth EC\$1000.00 for her poster. Award presentations will take place in January 2006.

The essay and poster competition is part of a larger public awareness campaign designed to increase knowledge of and familiarity with MEAs as important tools that can be used to support the sustainable development of this island. This programme is being implemented by the Anguilla National Trust with the assistance of the Department of Environment.
