Deadline for the Anguilla National Trust Photo Competition Extended

The Anguilla National Trust has extended the deadline for submission for the photo competition being held to celebrate Earth Day 2006. The new deadline is 4:00pm, Friday 28 April.

Prints can either be black and white or colour but should be 8" x 10" in size. Images should be of Anguilla and reflect the theme of the competition – Environment and Society. The prize for best photo in two age categories (Under-20 and Over-20) is a Nikon digital camera (value US\$360) sponsored by Ashley & Sons Ltd. and Cable & Wireless. Support is also being provided by Professional Photos Imaging Centre.

The Trust asks that participants remember to include their name, contact information, age category, and title of photo with their submission.

All photos will be incorporated into a fundraising Exhibit and prints will be available for purchase by the public. Profits of sales will be divided equally between the photographer and the Trust.

22 April marks the 36th anniversary of Earth Day. Founded by former US Senator Gaylord Nelson, Earth Day began in the United States in 1970 and expanded to the rest of the world in 1990. By 2000, approximately 5 000 environmental groups and hundreds of millions of people in 184 countries participated in Earth Day events. The fight to conserve the environment continues today and the Anguilla National Trust is proud to be among those who have accepted the challenge.
